### Video Club cameras to follow The Roach Valley Way

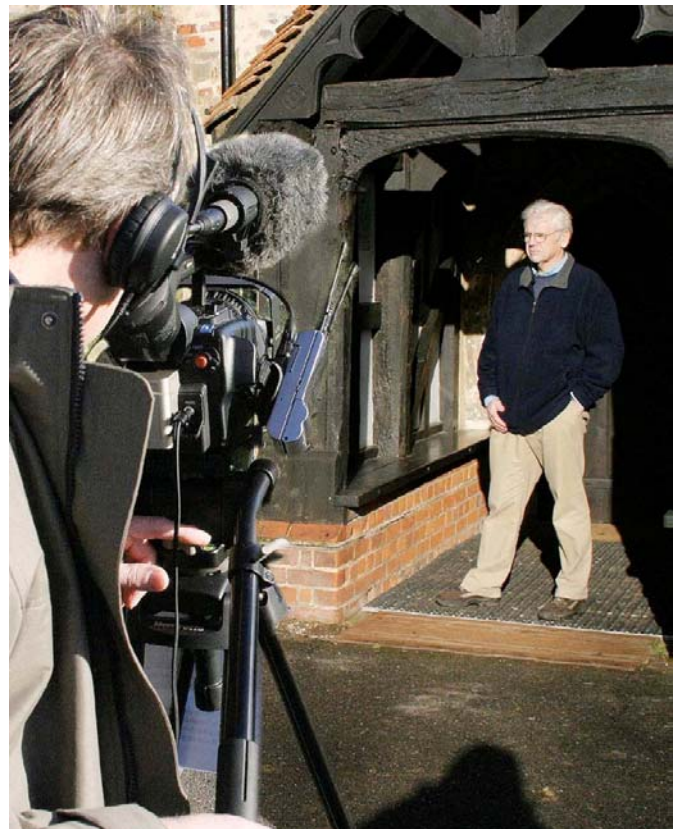
A crew from Westcliff Film and Video Club have started to film a documentary video about the popular *Roach Valley Way* walk and its history. The programme will be completed over the next few months and will be screened in the area later in the year. An initial sequence was shot at St. Andrews Minster in Ashington recently and covers the history of the battle of Assandun between Edmund Ironside and King Canute in 1016 .

Despite the film's historic connections the presentation will utilise the Club's modern technology to enable the film to be seen by a wide audience in DVD and Video.

The script is the work of member Chris Taylor who appears in the film as a roving reporter, while the technical work is being handled by Graham Gardener and John Eaton. The film will also serve as a means of teaching members how to record and edit such programmes to the best possible production standards.
